## **HDC Checklist for Application Submission**

**Before we accept an application,** please make sure you have met all the requirements for completeness:

Application for Certificate of Appropriateness: Please complete each section with a full description written in the "Explanation of Application"
section.
Application fee of \$50.00 in cash or check (written to "Town of Wethersfield").
<u>Before</u> you submit your application, decide on all the details of your proposal. Know what types of materials you will use and how the finished project will look.
Provide supplemental visual examples including drawings, plot plan, elevation drawings, line drawings, photographs, manufacturer cut sheets, and architectural drawings. Some of these visual examples of your plans should be a part of your application and each example is critical in helping the Commission understand your proposal. Professional drawings are not always required, but all visual images should be clear and detailed.
ALL information should be included in completion when you submit
<u>your application</u> . Remember to include details such as <i>siding</i> , <i>trim work</i> ,
corner boards, hardware, masonry, gutters, railings, stairs, lighting, decking,
fencing, retaining walls. Please indicate on the plans where these items will
be located as well as information detailing their construction.
We do not accept emailed pictures/files. Please provide printed copies.
Be sure that you and/or your contractor will be available for the Historic
District Commission meeting date and time. At least one representative
must be present during the meeting, prepared to present your information
to the Commission.
Homeowners: air conditioning condensers, generators, direct venting need
to be noted for permits. They typically don't require approval by the
Commission, they do require Coordinator approval. The preference is to
have all outdoor mechanicals located at the <u>rear</u> of the home or out of
public view. If this is not possible, the unit <i>must be screened</i> with evergreen
shrubbery of a proper height to obstruct public view. All information must
be documented on a plot plan and must include a description/photo of the
unit in order to obtain permits. No mechanicals in the front yard.
