

A TOWN-WIDE ASSESSMENT OF THE NEEDS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF MULTIPURPOSE SPORTS & RECREATION FACILITIES

Assessment Process

- Met with Parks and Recreation Board to discuss facilities availability, conditions and needs;
- Established an Athletic Facilities Assessment Committee;
 - Included Town Manager, Parks and Recreation Director, and two members of the Parks and Recreation Board (Colleen Mattatall and Suzanne Barton);
- Looked at all current facilities (purpose, use, and condition);
- Met with local sports leagues (primary users of the facilities) and to get their input on the local facilities (purpose, use, and conditions);
- Examined all Town and State-owned properties for potential opportunities for the development of additional needed facilities.



Assessment Report Format

Analysis of the Condition of Existing Facilities

- The current athletic facilities in Town are in substandard condition and in need of various repairs and upgrades;
- Some of the facilities utilized for sporting events were not designed for those uses and therefore do not meet the minimum standards.



Ongoing Maintenance and Care of Existing Facilities

- Regular maintenance of the facilities is not sufficient to keep up with the current use demands;
- Personnel and funding for regular maintenance of facilities is low when compared to that of neighboring communities with similar facilities.



Need for Additional Facilities

- 2-4 multi-use artificial turf fields to provide space for soccer, lacrosse, field hockey and football;
- Indoor space for pickleball, volleyball, and off-season training and conditioning space;
- One additional larger-sized little league baseball field for ages 12-13;
- Additional needs will be created if the proposed elementary school rebuilds move forward.



Opportunities for the Development of Additional Needed Facilities

- Examined all available Town and State-owned properties
 - Developable Lot Area (minus wetlands, floodplains and steep slopes).
 - Access to travel ways and potential traffic impacts.
 - Potential impacts to residential neighborhoods and/or schools.
- Determined two existing town-owned properties could currently accommodate multi-use field development
 - Mill Woods Park
 - Kycia
- There is a current need for additional indoor facilities but scope, size and location needs more analysis to determine best options.



Recommendations for Actions

- 1. Use available ARPA funds to develop 1-2 new artificial turf multi-use fields at either Kycia Farm or Mill Woods Park. Consider including a half-sized field for practice and drills as part of this development.
- 2. Consider a recreation bond (of up to \$5 million) to fund the much-needed major capital projects and to bring the facilities up to standard and to complete field development not covered by ARPA funds.
- 3. Begin to increase staffing and resources for parks and fields maintenance and develop an organizational restructuring in physical services that maintains dedicated field personnel through the fall and winter.
- 4. Reinstate seasonal staffing levels for parks and fields.
