Instructions to Applicants

Renewals for Armed Security Officers (Blue Cards/Class 1) and Bail Enforcement Agents (Gold Cards/Class2)

- Follow the instructions above for Pistol Permits Renewal by mail
- 2. An additional check or money order for \$62.00 is required, made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut."
- Armed Security Officers must submit a DPS-1030-C annually as proof of completion of the handoun qualification refresher course.

Eligibility Certificates (New & Renewals)

- New applicants, please contact SLFU for a packet to be mailed to you. This can be done by sending an email to SLFU.OOS@ct.gov and including what type of Eligibility Certificate you are requesting (Pistol or Long Gun), and including your name and mailing address within the body of the email.
- Renewal applicants must submit a DPS-129-C-2, with a \$35.00 fee made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut". Do not mail cash. Documentation of legal and lawful presence in the United States must also be included (see # 2 under "Pistol Permits New" for acceptable documents). A color passport photo must also be affixed to the DPS-129-C-2 form, and the form must be notarized.

Ammunition Certificates (New & Renewals):

- New applicants must complete DESPP-417-C, and sign it in the presence of an official.
- Include a 2" x 2" color passport photo, taken within the previous six (6) months. 2.
- 3. Submit check or money order for \$35.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut," for the processing of the Ammunition Certificate. Do not mail cash.
- Renewal applicants must submit a DPS-129-C-2 with \$35.00 fee made payable to "Treasurer State of Connecticut." Do not mail cash. A color passport photo must also be affixed to the DPS-129-C-2 form, and the form must be notarized.

NOTICE

Pursuant to C.G.S. §§ 29-28, 29-32, 29-36f 29-36l, and 18 U.S.C. § 922, applications covered by these instructions will not be issued or be renewed, if:

- 1. You have a FELONY CONVICTION in any jurisdiction.
- 2. You have a MISDEMEANOR CONVICTION in Connecticut for one of the following crimes in the preceding 20 years:
 - a. Criminally negligent homicide as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-58
 - b. Assault in the third degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-61
 - Assault of an elderly, blind, disabled, or pregnant person or a person with intellectual disability in the third degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-61a
 - d. Threatening in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-62
 - e. Reckless endangerment in the first degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-63
 - f. Unlawful restraint in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-96
 - g. Riot in the first degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-175
 - h. Riot in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-176
 - Inciting to riot as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-178
 - j. Stalking in the second degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-181d
- You have a MISDEMEANOR CONVICTION in Connecticut for illegal possession of controlled or hallucinogenic substances, as specified under C.G.S. § 21a-279 on or after 10/1/2015
- You are an unlawful user of or addicted to any controlled substance (as defined in the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 801, et. seq.).
- 5. You were CONVICTED of a MISDEMEANOR CRIME of DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

- 6. You were discharged from custody within the preceding 20 years after having been found NOT GUILTY OF A CRIME BY REASON OF MENTAL DISEASE OR DEFECT pursuant to C.G.S. § 53a-13.
- 7. You were CONFINED TO A HOSPITAL for persons with psychiatric disabilities (C.G.S. § 17a-495) within the preceding sixty (60) months by order of a Probate Court.
- 8. You have been voluntarily admitted to a hospital for persons with psychiatric disabilities, within the preceding six (6) months for reasons other than solely for alcohol or drug dependence.
- 9. You are subject to a RESTRAINING ORDER or PROTECTIVE ORDER issued by a court after notice and an opportunity to be heard has been provided to you in a case involving the use, attempted use or threatened use of physical force against another person.
- 10. You are the subject of a court issued risk warrant to seize firearms pursuant to C.G.S. § 29-38c(d).
- 11. You are an ILLEGAL ALIEN in the United States.
- 12. You are UNDER the AGE of 21 years.
- 13. You have renounced your United States citizenship.
- 14. You have been discharged from the Armed Forces under a dishonorable condition.
- 15. You are prohibited by federal law, under 18 U.S.C. 922 (g) or (n).



Procedures Regarding Pistol Permit Applications

The guidelines for obtaining both a local and state pistol permit are contained in C.G.S., sec. 29-28, 29-28a, and 28-29.

You are required to complete a handgun safety course, which must consist of no less than the NRA's "Basic Pistol Course," prior to submitting the application. The NRA's "Home Firearms Safety Course" and "First Steps Pistol Orientation Program" are **not** approved courses.

Live fire is also required. Computer-generated programs, dry fire, other simulated shooting tools, plastic bullets, air guns, or any other alternatives are **not** acceptable. Students must fire a semi-automatic pistol or revolver. Any questions should be referred to the "Special Licensing and Firearms Unit."

The NRA Home Firearm Safety Course is a 4-hour course designed to convey the skill, knowledge, and attitude to safely unload and store guns in the home and does live fire is not a part of this course.

Effective July 01, 2024, there is now a two-year expiration date on NRA certificates, and additional training is required. An affidavit needs to accompany the certificate as well.

It is our intention to issue permits to carry a pistol or revolver only to persons fully qualified. Please aid us in this regard by following, carefully, the steps included below:

STEP NO.1: Fill out, completely and accurately, the application for the permit. Any falsehoods, misrepresentations, or material omissions may be cause for rejection of the application. The applicant should completely read and understand the portion of the application that enumerates the laws concerning pistol permits. The application must be notarized in the appropriate section. (*Include a working (cell) phone number on the application*).

STEP NO.2: When your application is completed, go to the town website to schedule your fingerprint appointment (see the next page for the steps to complete that), then, come to the Wethersfield Police Department to be fingerprinted. At the time of your fingerprinting, you must submit (a) your completed application; (b) a check or money order in the amount of \$70.00 made payable to the 'Town of Wethersfield (or exact cash); (c) proof of citizenship (i.e.: birth certificate, or passport — not expired); (d) resident alien card or naturalization certificate if applicable; (e) if you are a member of the military we need a copy of your DD-14 form showing discharge status (we cannot process your application without it); (f) Valid Connecticut Residence Identification (i.e.: driver's license); (g) We do require proof of Residency in Town. Do you have a recent piece of mail addressed to you that you could bring?

<u>STEP NO.3</u>: You are required to furnish a letter or certificate within the last two years attesting to your competence with a handgun, signed by an NRA Certified Pistol Instructor or Police Firearms Instructor and it must accompany a Certificate of Completion.

<u>STEP NO.4:</u> Once your fingerprints, have been checked by the Wethersfield Police, the State Police, and the FBI, and your application file has been evaluated and it is determined that you are a suitable person, the Wethersfield Police Chief will issue you a Temporary State Pistol Permit. The permit is valid for sixty (60) days. We will call you when it is ready to be picked up.

<u>STEP NO.5:</u> Once you have obtained the temporary permit, you must, within sixty (60) days personally submit that to Connecticut State Police Headquarters to obtain the regular State permit that is good for five (5) years. If you do not go to the Connecticut State Police Headquarters within those sixty (60) days of obtaining your temporary permit you will be required to start the process over again.

- 1. Go to the Town of Wethersfield website (www.wethersfieldct.gov)
- 2. Under Key Links (in blue on the right of the screen) select Police.
- 3. Under Additional Links (center of the screen) select Services.
- 4. Under Services, scroll down just passed the heading "Background Checks." Read the information in its entirety labeled "Attention Individuals Seeking Fingerprint Services." Pay the state their portion on the *flex check* link, take note of the code required, then you may go back to the town website and click the bold wording that says "Book an Appointment." New Legislative Requirements

As part of the passage of Public Act 23-53, there is a new requirement for the training portion of the pistol permit application process that goes into effect October 1, 2023 but does not affect anyone applying until July 1, 2024.

Anyone who has previously had their lesson plan approved by DESPP will need to resubmit that lesson plan to show their course of instruction includes "the state law requirements pertaining to safe storage in the home and in vehicles, lawful use of firearms and lawful carrying of firearms in public." You will also need to submit a list of instructors who will be teaching that class (First Name/Last Name/Pistol Permit #). Even if you believe your previously approved lesson plan included this, you will need to resubmit a copy to SLFU.

For any course submitted by October 1, 2023, you will receive notification of acceptance or denial by July 1, 2024.

Just a reminder, please include all relevant pieces of your curriculum.

- A full detailed lesson plan to include above listed changes (this does not mean PowerPoint only)
 - o Course itinerary or outline (showing the breakdown of hours in the course)
 - o All student materials or handouts (include a copy of student certificate)
 - o Written exams to be given (including exam answers)
 - Instructor Credentials (any and all applicable)
 - Expectations of students to pass (including live fire requirements)

Please make sure to include the completed information form (attached to this memo) for our internal tracking purposes, and in case we need to contact you for clarification or questions. This will also be who/where the letter of approval or denial gets sent to.

If you are teaching the NRA course, the current accepted course is the "Basics of Pistol Shooting". We are currently evaluating NRA lesson plans to determine what course will now be accepted and will provide further guidance when we complete our review.

RE: NRA Instructors -- New Legislative Requirements

The NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting, which includes a live fire component, has an accepted instructional method to satisfy General Statutes § previously been when applying for a pistol permit. However, Public Act 23-53, which was effective on October 1, 2023, has created new requirements for the training portion of the pistol permit application process and will affect anyone applying on or after July 1, 2024. Public Act 23-53 not only puts two-year expiration date training certificates, but it a on also mandates instruction on state law requirements pertaining to: 1) safe storage in the home and in vehicles; 2) lawful use of firearms; and 3) lawful carrying of firearms in public.

The NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting, which met the previous standard to obtain a pistol permit, will continue to be accepted after July 1, 2024. However, in order to satisfy Public Act 23-53, additional training will be required. To that end, DESPP will provide a standardized lesson plan addressing the new mandated requirements, which must be taught in conjunction with the NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting course. Along with that plan, DESPP will also provide an addendum, which must be signed by both the instructor and the student, acknowledging that the additional training was taught. That addendum must accompany the applicants' NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting Certificate of Completion in their application to the local issuing authorities. The local issuing authorities will be instructed not to accept an application without this signed addendum after July 1, 2024.

DESPP will post the lesson plan as well as the addendum on our website as soon as they are completed. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we navigate through these new mandates designed to make the citizens of Connecticut more cognizant of firearm laws and safe practices.
